Minutes of BSW Meeting November 12, 2012 (recorded by Miriam Rubman, edited by Bob Pandolfo)

1. December Meeting: This Sunday afternoon meeting is an experiment to be more child-friendly. BSW residents will speak on a variety of topics, including movie shoots and child physicians. BSW will pay the babysitting fee. Bob will e-mail and create a flier to publicize the meeting (created by Olgierd.)

2. Private Security: Glenn stated that there has not been much success in recruiting a sufficient number of members for the FY13 (July '12-June '13) period. We have 62 members when we should have 75 or 80. It will probably be our last year. He suggested that there be another meeting of the six volunteers to plan strategy to increase membership. David suggested that every member talk to his neighbor about joining.

5. Other business- Janice suggested that a separate flier be distributed asking residents to keep their porch lights on at night and tie it to losing the security patrol for lack of interest. Glenn explained how the local CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) aided people during and after Superstorm Sandy. Vera suggested that we ask a representative from Brooklyn Botanic Garden to speak at a BSW meeting.

From Co-President Bob Pandolfo:

Homeowner snow-clearing responsibility: Here's a quote from the Sanitation rule book: "Every owner, lessee, tenant, occupant, or other person having charge of any lot or building must clean snow and/or ice from the sidewalk within 4 hours after the snow has stopped falling, or by 11:00 AM if the snow has stopped falling after 9:00 PM the previous evening. Snow may **NOT** be thrown into the street."

Homeowners are advised to use porch lights at night. There are energy-efficient lights with photoelectric switches available. Lights on houses add needed light to our blocks, and are a crime deterrent. Also, placing your house number on the back of your house can identify your house to a neighbor just in case.

If your house is adjacent to a storm drain, keeping it clear of debris helps prevent floods on the street and possibly in our homes.

In the Garden Corner

December. Winter arrives on December 21 – the Winter Solstice. During December we lose about 14 minutes of daylight from the first to the twenty-second, and then gain three minutes between then and the end of the year – but it is unevenly distributed! We gain minutes of daylight in the evening, but it is not until the second week of January that the sunrise is earlier.

In the garden, there is still time to plant bulbs or decorative kale until the ground freezes. The kale may heave during the winter if its roots haven't spread. Clean-up continues and leaves mature. Remove dead leaves and annuals; compost them, but discard the leaves of roses, lilac, peonies and any others with sign of mildew. Leaf removal not only make property look tidy, but it cuts down on over-wintering insects. Once the ground has really chilled, spread mulch. Move the snow shovel out of the garage to an accessible location.

If you have evergreen bushes like holly, osmanthus, euonymus, and pyracanth cut branches to place in water for indoor winter decoration. Don't expect them to root, but occasionally they will. Plant rootings out in April/May. Check your dormant amaryllis and if there are signs of growth, bring it to daylight, and fertilize lightly. Keep it watered, but not wet. If poinsettia leaves are really showing color, put the plants on display. If not, continue the night-shading process.

Holiday trees should be kept cool and in a bucket of water until they are set up indoors. Still keep them in a cool spot, if possible, and in a tree holder that holds water, and keep the container full. The tree will take up the water, and it also helps to humidify the room. When needles begin to drop, it is time to remove the tree. Some trees were cut in early November so they may have begun to dry out before we purchase them. Run the lights sparingly because they accelerate the drying process, but mini-lights do not generate as much heat. Place the tree away from radiators, and be sure it does not block room exits.

If you purchase or are given a blooming poinsettia, keep it watered and in bright light. Next month I will discuss growing it on, for display for holidays in 2012. If holiday cacti have buds, water and feed lightly.

It's a quiet time in the garden. Save those catalogs for January reading and planning. Put up a squirrel-proof bird feeder, if there are no outdoor cats around.

Enjoy the quiet days of your winter garden, with happy holidays and a good new year. May you and your plants thrive.
